







# VotesforSchools Lesson Plan: 15 minutes

## Is “cancel culture” unfair?

			
1 min	<b>Feedback</b>	Whole class	Look at the results and feedback from last week's topic.
3-4 mins	<b>1. What is cancel culture?</b>	Whole class	Look at what “call-out culture” and “cancel culture” means and watch a video introducing them to cancel culture.
1 min	<b>2. Why are we talking about this?</b>	Whole class	Explore why this topic is important at the moment.
8-10 mins	<b>3. The call to be “cancelled”</b>	Pair	Look at different examples of celebrities/organisations that users have demanded be “cancelled” and discuss their thoughts.
3-5 mins	<b>4. Does the punishment fit the crime?</b>	Pair	Decide what consequences of being “cancelled” – which are all based on “real life” examples – they think are fair.
N/A	<b>Career Launchpad</b>	Whole class	An opportunity to see this topic in action in the real world. See below for details.
N/A	<b>Vote</b>	Whole class	Review the Yes/No arguments for this topic before casting their vote.
